2016 was a year of great forward progress! We finished our 8th year with significant accomplishments, especially because of the large capacity building grant from Sacred Harvest Foundation. The pages of this report will give much more specific information, but here's a little summary:

- We set more records in finances, participation numbers and volunteers
- We graduated our 81st SFI graduate!
- We finished our Board Policy Manual and a significant amount of "internal" document alignment with our Vision and Mission.
- We had 200 volunteers that gave us 5,436.75 hours of their precious time a 62% increase over 2015!!
- We published our SFI curriculum and rebranded our marketing materials the front cover of this report being part of our new "look."
- We repaired and painted the entire outside of the building it looks wonderful!!
- We successfully launched our new friend and fund raiser: Christmas at Court don't miss the pictures and plan to join us December 7 or 8, 2017!

From the Program Director



I am so glad to have a full year at My Safe Harbor under my belt. I knew MSH had something really special going on, but it wasn't until I got to experience it myself that I really understood the impact we are having. In 2016, I was able to join 21 women in their t ransformational journey through the Strong Families Institute. I met them when they first signed up as women who were unsure, nervous, and insecure. I watched as they began to make new relationships, obtain new knowledge and tools, gain a new perspective on life, and make a plan for the future. The women I met were strong and courageous mothers who loved their children but lacked in the areas of healthy relationships and appropriate tools and resources.

The women I know now are even stronger women who want to make a difference, not only in their own families but in the lives of their friends and community as well; and they know

what to do to get there. It has been an amazing and humbling experience to join these mothers in their process. As a social worker, I am taught that the client has the strength for change, meaning that the individual has the capacity to move in their own self-interest, even if only by small steps, and this movement will lead to increased strength and more change.

It is exciting for me to see this theory in practice. The women we work with learn that they are not defined by their past or limited by their present, but that they possess the power and strength to change their future.

I am encouraged by what the women at My Safe Harbor are doing; we are simply providing a platform for them, they are doing the work to change their lives, the lives of their children, and ultimately our community.

In 2016, we graduated 21 students (out of 22 who started), and started two new cohorts with 23 students who will graduate in June, 2017. **Since 2011, we have graduated 81 students and have a graduation rate of 85%.** We hope to see those numbers accelerate with our new curriculum, our increasing alumni participation and as the word gets out.

Rosa's Story

Rosa signed up for our SFI program after hearing about it at her son's school. She had recently gone through a divorce and was now a single mother of four children. Her self-esteem was very low and she was having some serious health problems. During her SFI program, she was scheduled to have a major surgery that would leave her immobile for several weeks. She was concerned about finishing SFI and even more worried about how she would take care of her home and children after surgery. Her eyes teared up when we told her that she could continue in the program and we would help her get through this tough time. It was Rosa's classmates, not MSH staff, who stepped up and took care of her and her family. They brought her food, cleaned her home, and gave her rides to class. Rosa shared, "My faith in God is great thanks to the blessings of being here (MSH)... He brought me here to this group where I met women like me, wonderful women with personal desires and wishes to learn to be better mothers, wives, but above all better human beings. Thank you for helping us to see that there are options for change for a life full of love, peace and friendship."



Our SFI Curriculum got a facelift! Thanks to the help of Mary Little (over 350 volunteer hours) and Jennifer Johnson, our editing consultant, we are on the home stretch of a major curriculum overhaul. By the time we're done this March, we'll have gone over every facilitator script, every workbook page and every PowerPoint slide. And in addition, it looks great, too! It was all part of the rebranding and marketing strategy that Sacred Harvest Foundation made possible this year.

Curriculum is really never done; tweaking is ongoing, but we are so proud to have the professional look to go with our effective content. It's another great step forward in our credibility.

Mother's Club & Flectives

Not every mother is ready for a 32 week intensive program. Our Mother's Club is a non-threatening, peer led weekly get-together where moms can talk about life and share helpful parenting tips. We host a mother's club at our facility every week, led by SFI graduates who volunteer their time. In 2015 we started our first off-site Mother's Club at Orange Grove Elementary and in 2016 we started 2 more; one at Franklin Elementary and the other at Jefferson Elementary. We also started working on two more off-site Mother's Clubs that will start in 2017.



We bring our Mother's Club program to the schools once a month to engage mothers who may not have heard about us or are not quite ready to come through our doors alone. We have had huge success with this model and are continuing to strengthen our partnership with the Anaheim Elementary School District.



Elective classes are held twice a week at our facility and offer an array of topics from self-esteem and parenting to sewing and cooking. This is another way of getting mother's into our building and start to build relationships with them. Our electives are taught by our SFI graduates and faithful volunteers. Our favorite electives this year were our sewing classes, Building Self Esteem, and Cooking a Thanksgiving Meal.



This year we had 134 mothers attend our Mother's Clubs and Electives. Many of those women also joined an SFI cohort after learning about our program in a Mother's Club or Elective.

Thanks to another superstar volunteer, Susi McLane, we started our first quilting club this year. Susi is a master quilter and she enthusiastically shepherds this group of 7-10 women. They meet twice a month to sew together and learn new skills. They are having a great time and their quilts are works of art!

Alumni Program



A key component of our model is our Alumni Program. We love that we don't have to close cases. Once you are a part of the MSH family, you remain a part of us. Our Alumni are vital to the success of all our programs. They serve as Mother's Club leaders and Elective teachers, Mentors to our SFI students, childcare volunteers, and more. They also stay connected to us in our monthly Alumni Reunion Potlucks. Our potlucks give our Alumni a chance to catch up with one another, to have a continuing education opportunity and to keep moving forward.

This year, we had 49 of our Alumni stay connected to us by attending a reunion or volunteering for us.

That's over 60%! We took 25 Alumni on an overnight retreat in August. For many of them, it was the first time they had taken time away for just themselves. It was a great time of connecting and growing.

I had such a heartbreaking, yet heartwarming and affirming first week back at work! EVERY DAY last week a Strong Families Institute alumna was in my office in the midst of deep personal struggle...EVERY DAY. The substance of their individual struggles isn't important – all of them were gut-wrenching and challenging and in all of them we cried and hugged and looked for hope and solutions together.

I guess what has hit me so hard is that for every one of them their pre-SFI choices would have been so different than the ones they're making now. To a person they were thinking clearly, seeking support, knowing they needed help, accurately using acquired evaluation skills to access their situation and coming in early in the crisis process to do these things...and they knew they would be safe coming in.

But maybe the most important thing to me in these shared experiences was this type of acknowledgment in the conversations: "I just knew I needed to get over here and connect. I want to make good choices right now and I want to be proactive in taking care of myself and my family." I'm tearing up just writing about this because it was such an affirmation to me that what we're doing...what God is doing... is bearing REAL fruit.

Anyone who is mature knows that life is full of challenges. No matter what "program" you graduate from, it doesn't inoculate you from life. I'm just so thrilled, so pleased, so grateful that God is leading so many on this pathway to hope and that our SFI grads are taking big steps...make that strides...toward becoming all that God wants them to be...even when life remains hard. It's just what I needed as we start a new year...My Safe Harbor IS making a difference. We MUST keep planting those seeds of hope!

Once again our volunteers provided a crucial boost to our productive work! We had 200 volunteers give us 5,436.75 hours! We are so fortunate to have such a HUGE volunteer corps that does the hard work of keeping us going. They manage things behind the scenes, keep us looking good, teach and mentor and lead, take care of our children, and so much more.

In case you didn't know, we categorize our volunteer hours by three monetary distinctions: \$8 per hour for general assistance, child care, clerical work, custodial, etc.; \$20 for leadership assignments like facilitating Mother's Clubs, Electives, being an SFI Mentor or on a working committee, etc.; and \$36 for professional services like computer/tech support, curriculum development, MSH Board members, etc. As a result of that the 5,436.75 hours translates into \$86,568.00 of equivalent dollars we would have to spend to do all the work!! What a gift that is to us. There are so many volunteers now that the place is always jumping with people who believe in what we do and put their time on the line to keep us moving forward. We are SO blessed!

One of the most thrilling things is to see how many of our SFI graduates volunteers are serving as volunteers – 36 in 2016. That is 44% of the graduates we have! They serve in a variety of ways and they bring such energy and passion to the work. They are great workers and they are fabulous ambassadors for MSH. This year's Volunteer Appreciation Banquet was part of Christmas at Court! 



2016 Financial Report



The most often asked question about our finances is, "How do you do it?!" We have continued to grow our program and at a significant rate, but our staff has stayed the same...we still only have ONE full time employee. Because our volunteers are so many and so dedicated even we are amazed at all that gets done!

The dilemma is that the day is fast approaching that we must move to more full time staff. Except for the Executive Director, the staff is all at 24 hours week. Mother's Clubs in area schools are facilitated by SFI volunteers but they are resourced and

supported by staff. By the end of 2017 we hope to have at 6-8 of them and to keep adding them as we can. As you read this we will have added another SFI cohort to the two that started in October; yes, that means we'll have 3 simultaneous groups going. Plus there will be more coming in April and October. We presently have 200 women on our roster and keeping them connected and informed is a growing challenge. Consequently we are stepping up our work to find grants and new partners to keep us growing. The good news is that we don't need to hire more staff, we just need to expand the hours of the staff we have!

67 Individuals and 13 Organizations gave us a record \$264,548.27 in 2016. Over 60% of the money given in the Individual Donor category was given by just 23 people. What a committed group!! Again, we need to swell those ranks! If you are not already a regular donor for MSH, 2017 would be a great year to start! \$2.75 a day puts a woman through SFI. It so doable! OR...

- \$25 covers a day for one of our school Mother's Clubs
- \$50 covers costs for one of our electives
- \$100 covers the cost of one day for our child care
- \$85 **a month** covers the **annual** tuition for one SFI mother.

Our goal in 2017 is to double the number of REGULAR givers. Not only does it help cash flow, it connects more people to the regular work – day in and day out. Could you join us? Whether a onetime gift, or a monthly commitment, ANY amount will help.



However, we must find more to join them and us! Remember that as you look through these numbers:




